



## Indianapolis Motor Speedway Administration Building



This building replaces the old museum building at the corner of 16<sup>th</sup> Street and Georgetown Road, at the main entrance to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

It is a 60,000 square foot, 3-story building which provides space for the IMS executive and administration offices and ticket sales. It has a full, 15,000 square foot basement to be used for mechanical equipment, storage and future expansion.

The exterior consists of two types of brick veneer and blue glazed glass curtain wall. Space frames are utilized to provide three building canopies and to distinguish the Speedway's main gate. The east and west wings are swept forward at 15 degree angles.

Structural features:

- Basement is cast-in-place concrete
- Structural framework is steel
- Supported floors are composite floor systems consisting of concrete and steel deck
- Upper roof is metal deck supported by steel frame
- Cast-in-place concrete stair and elevator towers, which extend the full height of the building, economically act as shearwalls to resist the wind and lateral loads
- Two areaways to the basement for HVAC usage
- A roof top patio for the executive offices
- Two separate parking areas offer parking for employees and visitors
