The speedway actually consists of more than 20 racing venues – from the main 1.5-mile track to a national caliber drag strip, from four grueling motorcross tracks to a paved figure-eight course. The track held its inaugural race Sept. 16, 1996, with the Las Vegas 500K, an Indy Racing League sanctioned event.



In addition to the modern concessions, rest rooms with attendants, helicopter landing port, shuttle service and lavish provisions for the speedways' visitors, the speedway's plans include a 2 million sq. ft. industrial park and a research facility which will attract automotive businesses from around the globe.
