Nestled in grandeur on the eastern slope of the Colorado Rockies is racing's newest, and possibly fastest, one-mile track. The spectacle of America's best drivers competing at the base of Pikes Peak is sure to be breathtaking.

The track debuted in June 1997 with USAC and Indy Racing League races. In that month, PPIR serviced notice that it may well be the fastest one-mile race track in the world. NASCAR Winston West, AMA Superbikes and SCCA Trans-Am races fill out PPIR's first summer.

The facility features pedestrian and vehicular tunnels along with permanent rest rooms, concessions, care center, administration/maintenance building and retail shop areas.

Pikes Peak International Raceway is proof that a world-class racing facility costing approximately \$40 million can be designed and built – with the right team.

Though grandstand capacity is now 40,000 spectators, plans have already been created to expand the facility to handle 100,000. PPIR also has designated areas for RVs and general admission just outside the backstretch wall – providing excellent views of the track and the scenic mountains.
